JOB DESCRIPTION

Job Grade: Research, Grade 5

Job purpose

An enthusiastic individual is sought to work with Dr Sophie Batchelor on an ESRC-funded project investigating the development of children's early numerical skills. The aim of the project is to examine links between children's informal 'spontaneous' focusing on number and their formal mathematics achievement. This will involve a range of studies carried out with preschool and primary-school-aged children, including experimental and standardised tests and classroom observations. The post is for 1 year and is available from 1st January 2016.

The successful candidate will be responsible for setting up experiments, liaising with schools and preschools to recruit participants, and collecting data. They will be involved in the input and analysis of data and they will have the opportunity to contribute to interpretation and write-up of the research.

JOB DUTIES:

1. To liaise with preschools and primary schools to recruit participants for research studies and conduct studies both at Loughborough University and at external sites.
2. To take an active role in the collation and analysis of data using a variety of methods and tools.
3. To contribute to aspects of dissemination of results such as writing methods and results sections of publications and preparing conference posters.

4. To take advantage of appropriate professional development opportunities, such as conference attendance and participation in the general academic life of the Mathematics Education Centre.
5. To contribute to the design and development of experimental studies, including use of computerised experimental software.
6. To take part in dissemination activities involving academics, teachers and the general public.
7. Any other duties appropriate to the grade and role of the post holder.
