Job Description

Job Purpose

To take a leading role in developing and enhancing the research, teaching and enterprise activities of the Institute for Digital Technologies in the areas of interactive and immersive video experiences, from production, processing to delivery and consumption, in support of the University's Strategy, Building Excellence.

Job Duties

Research

- To pursue a personal research programme consistent with the research priorities of the Institute for Digital Technologies that increases the global visibility and reputation of the University.
- To secure external research funding.
- To supervise and manage research projects funded through internal and external funding sources.
- To publish research results in outlets of international standing.
- To attend and contribute to major international conferences.
- To supervise postgraduate students at Masters and Doctoral levels.
- To collaborate in research initiatives with colleagues with overlapping or complementary research interests.

Teaching

- To work with colleagues in the School to deliver an exceptional learning environment for students.
- To teach and inspire students studying at Loughborough University London and to conduct associated assessments.
- To provide academic and pastoral support to students.
- To promote the use of a range of methods and techniques in teaching, learning and assessment.
- To engage in the evaluation and development of modules for which you have responsibility, in terms of content, delivery and assessment.
- To cooperate with colleagues in the continuous review and development of taught programmes and the curriculum.

Enterprise

- To engage with business, public and voluntary organisations through knowledge exchange activities such as student projects and placements, research collaboration, consultancy and specialist training.
- To create social, cultural and economic impacts from academic, especially research, activity.
