Department summary

Student Wellbeing and Inclusivity Team (SWAI) provides support, advice and guidance to students with a range of disabilities and emotional needs. The Specialist Study and Strategy Support Team, which is part of SWAI, delivers 1:1 specialist study and strategy skills to students with a neurodiverse profile. The support offered is student centered and designed to respond to the individual's needs.

Job Description

Job Grade: CL 6

Job Purpose

- To plan and deliver individualised 1:1 specialist study and strategy sessions for students experiencing a range of neurodiverse profiles including dyslexia, dyspraxia, A(D)HD and Autistic Spectrum Conditions, alongside cooccurring mental health and wellbeing issues
- To provide specialist professional activity in support of the service in conjunction with a team of colleagues.
- To provide advice and guidance, where necessary and appropriate, on complex yet routine matters to colleagues to ensure appropriate support is accessible for neurodiverse students.

Job Duties

- In collaboration with the student, use analysis and judgement from Diagnostic Assessment reports and/or Disabled Students Allowance (DSA) Needs Assessment reports, to identify specific development requirements.
- To plan and deliver individual study skills tutorials based in the above.
- To implement a range of multi-sensory and metacognitive strategies to facilitate independent learning.
- To regularly review and adapt individual workplans, in collaboration with the student.
- To monitor and maintain accurate and auditable records to support the individual student's learning and development.
- To deliver practical application of specialist assistive technology available to support neurodiverse students, and to encourage students to use their own packages effectively as part of their repertoire of study and strategy skills.
- To work within internal University and SWAI guidelines and protocols, and external DSA-QAG policies and procedures. This includes working within codes of practice and regulations relevant to this role.
- To liaise with colleagues within SWAI to facilitate holistic and appropriate support for neurodiverse students.

- To keep up to date with developments in the field of neurodiverse support for HE students in line with the needs for quality assured membership of a professional body.
- To have and maintain, up-to-date quality assured membership of a DSA recognised professional body which includes, but is not limited to, ADSHEE, PATOSS, Dyslexia Guild and BDA.
- To contribute to the planning of future service developments within the role and the wider service.
- Other duties in keeping with the spirit of the post as directed by the Practice Lead.
