Project Title: To develop a simulator enabling commercially viable last-mile delivery in rural and semi-urban environments using autonomous Unmanned Aircraft Systems.

About the Project

This is a 30-month Knowledge Transfer Partnership (KTP) project between Loughborough University and Aujla Business Systems Limited, funded by UKRI Innovate UK.

Global society is rapidly adopting autonomous systems across industry and public life. This requires novel ways for citizens and organisations to envisage what this new future might look like when it becomes part of everyday life. This KTP will produce an interactive simulator to visualise the integration of Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS - more colloquially referred to as drones) for last-mile delivery in rural and semi-urban environments. The delivery contexts could be wide-ranging (e.g. medical, retail) and the simulator will empower affected officials, businesses, and citizens to envisage, plan and manage the implementation of UAS.

This interactive simulator – the Autonomous Infrastructure Simulator (AIS) - will be developed by Aujla Business Systems Limited (ABS), which has a foundation in software architecture, intelligent city data, and digital security. To ensure compatibility with the needs of citizen stakeholders (members of the public with an interest in their local environment) and customer stakeholders (as part of their job role, e.g. local authorities and healthcare providers), ABS will leverage Loughborough University's academic knowledge on human-centred design.

Through long-standing UK local authorities and NHS contracts, ABS is uniquely positioned to access invaluable data and testbeds. ABS is also partnered with the NHS Innovation scheme, which ensures that vital stakeholders are accessible to the Project for consultation, design, testing and product development. The KTP will leverage these relationships to produce market-ready solutions.

KTP Associate Role

The KTP Associate will be based primarily at Aujla Business Systems Ltd, in Farnborough, Hampshire as well as Loughborough University with the academic team. The Associate will be supervised by an academic team, led by Dr Tracy Ross and Dr Chris Parker, who are experts in human-centred design and UX design.

A Knowledge Transfer Partnership (KTP) is a unique collaborative partnership between businesses and universities to create a positive impact and drive innovation. The KTP Associate works with the business to implement innovative solutions to identified business challenges, using the knowledge and expertise gained through their academic training. The academic partner (Loughborough University) supports and guides the KTP Associate throughout the project.

The Associate will be required to engage with citizens, customers and internal (ABS) stakeholders; critically evaluate their (potentially) conflicting needs for the Autonomous Infrastructure Simulator (AIS); distil these into human-centred requirements specifications; work with ABS to translate these into an initial prototype and iteratively evaluate and redesign this prototype to enable ABS to produce the final design of the AIS.

The Associate will be required to develop novel ways to engage citizens and customers with not-yet-experienced future innovations in meaningful ways and to work closely with ABS staff to ensure a legacy for this methodological knowledge within the company. The Associate will work closely with ABS software developers to understand the technical limitations of ABS software and how these might impact stakeholder requirements.

The Associate will need to adopt an agile mindset and working methods to bring together the external (citizen, customer) requirements - likely to be diverse, multi-layered, conflicting, and ambiguous - with the need for a commercially driven process, pivoting design direction as required. Training will be provided in agile methodologies.

The KTP Associate will:

- Review state-of-the-art knowledge for the human-centred design of the simulator, drawing on research in citizen engagement, unmanned flight and urban planning.
- Engage with stakeholders, including citizens, local authorities and healthcare providers, to determine user requirements for the simulator, involving ABS staff in this activity.
- Collaborate with ABS to design and evaluate the service through prototypes, increasing fidelity from concept to low, medium, and high fidelity, resulting in the final ABS simulator.
- Document work regularly, ensuring knowledge and outcomes are transferred to other team members, and embedded HCD knowledge within the company, creating a knowledge repository throughout the project.
- Organise presentations and workshops with ABS staff to transfer and embed HCD knowledge in the company.
- Provide project updates at supervision meetings, LMCs, advisory panel meetings, and other necessary forms
 of engagement and dissemination.

Job Duties

- Develop and innovate.
- Carry out the KTP project tasks and deliver the outcomes outlined in the project workplan.
- Manage the project and disseminate key deliverables/findings to the project team and key stakeholders to facilitate the progress of the digital product.
- Managing the project budget.
- Undertake KTP management training, personal development training, and courses as deemed necessary.
- Prepare research papers for publication in journals/conferences in line with the expected scholarly activities of the University Research Staff and in accordance with the sensitivity of collaborating companies.
- Travel to company business partners within the UK.
- To undertake such other duties as may be reasonably requested and commensurate with the nature and grade of the post.
