The School of Design and Creative Arts is seeking new colleagues to undertake a dedicated teaching and scholarship role in the area of Digital Design, supporting teaching across UX, Service Design and Graphic Design. Expertise in UX and UI design, digital design for graphic communication, service design or in digital product design, is a must. This is an intensive teaching post that will deliver a variety of skills, knowledge and practice in support of project briefs and assessment tasks to significant student numbers. The post holder will work closely with Academic and Technical staff in developing high quality pedagogic approaches in facilitating the taught programmes, and to ensure outcomes of high standard.

The School of Design and Creative Arts delivers digital design across a breadth of programmes including the BA Graphic Design and BA Design, and across the masters offers in UX, Service Design and Graphic Design & Visualisation. Programmes actively engage with industry via external projects, industry links, live projects and student competitions and seek to emphasise the real-world impact design can have. Programmes rank amongst the best in the country. Fashion and Textiles, Product Design and Graphic Design in the School of Design and Creative Arts at Loughborough University rank 1st in the Guardian University Guide 2023. Art and Design at Loughborough University ranks 2nd in the Times Good University Guide 2023, and the Complete University Guide 2023. Results of the 2021 Research Excellence Framework show that 100% of Loughborough University's research impact in Art and Design is now rated as 'world-leading' or 'internationally excellent'.

Job Description

Job Grade: Specialist and Supporting Academic Grade 7

Fixed-term contract 2 x 1.0 fte until July 2025, available to job share

Job Purpose:

The post holder will be expected to contribute to teaching on existing and future Undergraduate and Postgraduate modules. This will include developing and delivering lectures, tutorial sessions, practical workshops, group-working with students and other staff, engaging in assessment, and providing feedback to students. The post holder will be expected to engage with external audiences and professional organisations in support of subject, programme, school and university initiatives relating to taught delivery and admissions.

The post holder will work with Academic and Technical staff to develop practical, conceptual and theoretical approaches to delivering core aspects of Digital Design.

Under the Teaching and Scholarship Contract, the Postholder will undertake teaching and enterprise activities.

Job Duties:

- To contribute to the teaching team and teaching and learning provision across design, graphic design, UX and/or service design subject areas at undergraduate and postgraduate levels.
- To represent the programme in appropriate School committee meetings, programme boards and open days.
- To contribute to programme meetings and encourage a collegiate approach in the programme team.

• To foster collaborative opportunities with external bodies and organisations in support of university requirements.

Teaching

- Work with colleagues to deliver an exceptional learning environment for students.
- Teach and inspire undergraduate and postgraduate students through lectures, tutorials, and seminars.
- Lead on the practical, technical and theoretical delivery of UX and/or graphic design practice.
- To be responsible for the design and content of specific areas/themes of teaching and learning in the school's taught degree programmes as appropriate.
- To engage in the development and evaluation of modules in terms of content, delivery and assessment of specific areas/themes of teaching and learning in the school's undergraduate and postgraduate taught degree programmes.
- To undertake necessary academic duties including supervising dissertations, setting, and marking of assessments and coursework.
- To provide academic support to undergraduate and postgraduate students on relevant modules.
- To promote the use of a range of effective methods and techniques in teaching, learning and assessment.
- To cooperate with colleagues in the review and development of taught programmes and curriculum.
- To participate in the design, delivery and supervision of technical activities where appropriate to the role.
- To take on learning and teaching related roles, as necessary.
- To retain subject authority by engaging in appropriate scholarship activities.

Student Support

- Prepare and deliver workshops and induction sessions as appropriate.
- Act as a Personal Academic Tutor to allocated students in the School on academic and pastoral matters, including signposting students to the relevant Support Service, where required.
- Act as a Placement Visit Tutor and visit students on placement in industry/business where required.

Enterprise and Scholarship

- Engage in scholarly activities as appropriate to ensure integration of practice with current research evidence.
- Engage with business, public and voluntary organisations through knowledge exchange activities such as student projects and placements, technology transfer collaboration, consultancy and specialist training.
- Where appropriate, to secure internal and external funding in support of activities related to innovations in teaching and learning.
- To support any short course and professional education opportunities working with partners if required.

Related Activities and Functions

- Work effectively with relevant administrative, technical and academic staff in the school and across the University.
- Actively support student recruitment including participation in open days, visit days and summer schools.
- Carry out specific administrative roles and functions as may be reasonably required.
- Take part in one or more School committees if required.
- Engage in training programmes in the University (e.g. through Organisational Development) which are consistent with your needs and aspirations and those of the school.

• Undertake such other duties as may be reasonably requested and that are commensurate with the nature and grade of the post.
