Job Description

Loughborough University is seeking to appoint a Chair of the Open Research Working Group (0.1 FTE) to support our Open Research activity. The Group consists of Open Research Leads representing each of Loughborough's Schools, and members of the Library, Research and Innovation Office, and IT Services. This role helps to lead and coordinate Loughborough's work in this area in line with Loughborough's Open Research Position Statement and broader Research & Innovation Culture ambitions.

The expectation is that the role will be filled by an experienced researcher with a passion for and commitment to Open Research, who can demonstrate a willingness to lead by example in making their research openly available.

Main Duties

- To chair the Open Research Working Group (ORWG).
- To work collegiately with Professional Services and Academic colleagues to enhance Loughborough's Open Research activity helping deliver key objectives of the R&I Core plan and our University Strategic ambitions.
- To support the implementation of the Open Research Position Statement.
- To help facilitate and co-ordinate the work of the Academic Open Research Leads.
- To enable a clear understanding of disciplinary differences in Open Research.
- To advocate for Open Research to academic colleagues and senior management.
- To act as an exemplar in Open Research activity and to continue to move Loughborough's "Open" work beyond compliance.
- To serve as a member of University bodies and committees, as appropriate, where issues of relevance to Open Research are considered.
- To act as a representative of Loughborough to external groups and organisations in the Open Research area.
- Regular 1:1s with PVC(R&I) and or APVC (R&I – Impact and Internationalisation) to update on activity.

Points to Note

Organisational Responsibility
