Job Description

Job Family and Grade: Management and Specialist Grade 6 (MA6)

Job Purpose:

Working closely with the Head of Performance Support and Roses Head Coach, and working collaboratively with other coaches, athletes, and the wider Loughborough Sport performance support team to lead and deliver the performance analysis services at England Netball. The role will lead on the Performance Analysis provision for the Roses, aiming to provide accurate and reliable performance insights and positively impact performance, helping the Roses to achieve their ambitions in Sydney 2027 (World Cup) and beyond.

Duties & Responsibilities:

- Lead and deploy England Netball Performance Analysis staff and ensure effective delivery of analysis to key staff within the programme.
- Work closely with coaches and technical supervisors to deliver world leading performance analysis services to Roses athletes.
- Quality assurance across the performance analysis service to ensure consistent use of accurate and reliable data and produce effective and compelling analytical insights to enhance the coaching process and subsequently impact performance.
- Lead and manage performance analysis projects through working collaboratively with stakeholders.
- Collaborate with the Pathway Performance Analyst on the Roses Athlete Assessment process to ensure that performance data and assessor insight play a key role in informing programme and squad selection.
- Contribute to the development of long-term strategy surrounding performance analysis infrastructure, equipment and software.
- Develop and contribute to a diverse and impactful CPD programme for performance analysis across Loughborough Sport and England Netball. With the aim to develop both technical and non-technical analytical skills and provide exposure to external practitioners and environments.
- Help foster and drive relationships with key stakeholders both internally and externally (NGBs) to further enhance performance analysis support at Loughborough and England Netball.

- Support the Loughborough Sport Commercial Team in the management and implementation of the relationship with HUDL, Catapult and other commercial opportunities to England Netball
